THEME: Recovering Better for a Sustainable and Equitable World

1. VIDEO/TIKTOK

Guidelines:

- 1. The contest is open to all Grade 12 students in all schools (private and public) in Region 3.
- 2. Entries must be 30 seconds to 1-minute videos created by the students through the app TikTok. Contestants will create a TikTok around the theme: Recovering Better for a Sustainable and Equitable World.
- 3. Entries must be submitted through email to Mr. Alvin Maniti at alvinmaniti@yahoo.com. Name, Grade, Name of Adviser/Coach (if any), and Name of Institution must be included in the email.
- 4. Appropriate sound/music must be used (may be original music). Videos may not use copyrighted music. No profanities or inappropriate language should be used.
- 5. Appropriate skit/dance/appearance/clothing or gestures should be used.
- 6. Videos must not infringe the privacy or personality rights of any living or deceased person.
- 7. Deadline for submission of entries is September 17, 2021.
- 8. Announcement of results will be via email and awarding of winners is September 24, 2021.
- 9. Winners will receive a cash prize and a certificate of participation for the school/institution.
- 10. The decision of the judges shall be final.

Rubrics/Criteria:

The creativity and execution of the following will be considered:

- 1. Transitions/Effects (10%)
- 2. Originality(40%)
- 3. Visual Appeal (40%)
- 4. Adherence to Guidelines(10%)

2. SPOKEN POETRY IN FILIPINO

Guidelines:

- 1. Spoken poetry is a performance that is word-based. It is spoken or recited with emotion. It is an oral art that focuses on the art of word play, rhythm, improvisation, intonation, and voice inflection.
- 2. The contest is open to all Grade 12 students in all schools (private and public) in Region 3.
- 3. Entries must be in video form. The piece/composition must be related to the theme: Recovering Better for a Sustainable and Equitable World.
- 4. Entries must be submitted through email to Mr. Alvin Maniti at alvinmaniti@yahoo.com. Name, Grade, Name of Adviser/Coach (if any), and Name of Institution must be included in the email.
- 5. The spoken poetry piece must be an original composition, in Filipino or English but not Taglish.
- 6. The spoken poetry must be delivered from memory or with a copy at hand.
- 7. Each entry must be submitted in PDF copy of the piece and a 3-5 minute recorded video of the delivery of the piece on or before September 17, 2021.
- 8. Appropriate sound/music must be used (may be original music). Videos may not use copyrighted music. No profanities or inappropriate language should be used.
- 9. Appropriate appearance/clothing or gestures should be used.
- 10. Videos must not infringe the privacy or personality rights of any living or deceased person.
- 11. Sounds, instruments, or musical background is allowed to complement the delivery. No deduction shall be made if the contestant opts not to have a musical background.
- 12. Announcement of results will be via email and awarding of winners is September 24, 2021.
- 13. Winners will receive a cash prize and certificate of participation for the agency or institution.
- 14. The decision of the judges shall be final.

PRIZES:

1st Prize: P500 GCASH or cellphone load

2nd Prize: P300 GCASH or Cellphone load

3rd Prize: P 200 GCASH or Cellphone load

Rubrics/Criteria:

Message/Content (40%) (must be relevant to the theme; has a powerful and meaningful message)

Delivery and Performance (30%) (delivered from the heart, facial expression, hand and body gestures emphasize the elements of the performance, enunciation is clear)

Originality (20%) (original composition by the contestant)

Overall Impact (10%) (total success of the performance)



3. ESSAY WRITING (Filipino and English)

Guidelines:

1. The contest is open to all Grade 12 students in all schools (private and public) in Region 3.

2. Entries should be in English or Filipino, encoded, double-spaced, use Times New Roman 12 font, with a minimum of 750 words and a maximum of 1,500 words. The piece/composition must be related to the theme: Recovering Better for a Sustainable and Equitable World.

3. Entries must be submitted m through email to Mr. Alvin Maniti at alvinmaniti@yahoo.com. Name, Grade, Name of Adviser/Coach (if any), and Name of Institution must be included in the email. Each entry must be submitted in PDF copy on or before September 17, 2021.

4. Details showing the name of the writer, his or her contact numbers, and email address should be placed on a separate page.

5. Announcement of results will be via email and awarding of winners is September 24, 2021.

6. Winners will receive a cash prize and certificate of participation for the agency or institution.

7. The decision of the judges shall be final.
