

Background

APNIEVE is a non-profit organization of individuals and institutions from the private and public sectors and is affiliated with the United Nations Educational, Social, and Cultural Organization (UNESCO). The network was founded by a group of eight experts from Australia, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Philippines, Russian Federation, and Thailand in March 1995 in Seoul.

Inspired by UNESCO's vision-mission of "Peace for Development and Development for Peace," APNIEVE was created "to promote and develop international education and values education for peace, human rights, democracy, and sustainable development through networking and cooperation among individuals, groups and institutions working on these fields in the Asia Pacific and the rest of the world." Sub-themes of the Convention

1. "Leadershift" in the VUCA World

Atty. Rolando A. Bernales, Ed.D.

"You cannot be the same, think the same and act the same if you hope to be successful in a world that does not remain the same," writes John C. Maxwell. How does a leader then do more than just hang on and survive in this kind of an ever-changing, fast-moving environment? "The key," says Maxwell, "is to learn how to continually make leadershifts." Needless to say, that's what Leadershift/Leadershifting is all about, a new leadership paradigm in response to the VUCA world. The increase in volatility, uncertainty, complexity, and ambiguity (VUCA) means that leaders and organizations must seek new orientations and take a fresh approach to management. Only then leaders guarantee positive results in changed circumstances. The VUCA world challenges leaders to find their own way. They will need to understand the psychologic and develop empathic behaviour – in short, to be more concerned with humans and their needs. Meaning and purpose now take a central role in human activities.

Thus, VUCA takes a new meaning in Leadershifting: Vision, Understanding, Clarity, Adaptability/Agility.

- Developing, implementing and assessing innovative leadership/leadershift paradigms/approaches in educational institutions
- Enhancing innovative professional development for leadershift in a VUCA world
- Developing innovative processes for effective leadershift in a VUCA world

2. Pedagogies in the New Normal: Cybergogy, Heutagogy, Paragogy, Hyflex

Digital pedagogies are critical pedagogical approaches that deliberately incorporate digital technologies into the learning process and thoroughly evaluate their influence on applied pedagogies. During the new normal and moving towards Education 5.0, teachers are increasingly required to incorporate digital techniques into their classrooms to aid students in their learning. Participants will gain a new perspective on how to teach values education via the use of innovative computer-based approaches.

- Developing, implementing, and assessing innovative pedagogies during the new normal
- Enhancing innovative professional development for teachers to achieve digital competencies for cybergogy, heutagogy, paragogy and hyflex
- Developing innovative processes for the effective implementation of various pedagogies in the new normal.

3. Digital Citizenship Education

Digital Citizenship Education aims to develop the skills and knowledge among learners for them to effectively use digital technologies to participate in education and society, communicate with others, and create and consume digital content. Digital education competencies are the skills, knowledge, and attitudes in collaboration with others in a critical, responsible, and creative manner: student internet safety awareness, digital communication, retrieving digital information, creating digital content, and problem-solving.

- Looking at empirical research especially focusing on teachers' and pupils' deeper understandings of peace, human rights, democracy and sustainable development.
- Suggesting that citizenship education, which emphasizes responsibility to humankind and shared values, may be the foundation to transcend inequalities and injustice at global, national and local levels.
- Developing, implementing, and assessing innovative practices and approaches for developing digital citizens
- Preparing educators for digital citizenship education

4. Values Education/Edukasyon sa Pagpapakatao and Values Integration across the Curriculum and Shared Filipino Values

The Philippine Values Education Program has evolved since its inception after the People Power Revolution. What are the challenges it must face and opportunities it can maximize in the onset of Education 5.0?

- School-wide practices that support quality and inclusive values education programs/ESP in basic education and values integration in higher education towards Education 5.0
- Classroom practices that show values education/ESP in basic education and values integration in higher education towards Education 5.0
- Demonstration of modules for values education/ESP in the basic education or values integration in higher education

The subthemes revolve around the leading-edge thinking leadershifts and digital citizenship education towards Education 5.0; innovative approaches and practices, and the assessment, monitoring and evaluation; and the gaps where more research and efforts are needed. These subthemes are situated within the context of APNIEVE's twin thrusts: values education and international education, and APNIEVE's core values of peace, human rights, democracy, gender equity, and sustainable development, in order to achieve inclusive and quality education by 2030.

Presentations will focus around basic research, applied research, best practices, and module/lesson demonstrations. Presentations (30 minutes) on research and best practices will be on digital citizen education and leadershifts. Workshops (45 minutes) will concentrate
