Dearest Superintendent Mostoles, Ed.D.:

Greetings of Peace and Good Health!

The socio-political, economic and moral crises that we are facing in the Philippines today - which is very evident in the regressive state of progress in our nation - are due to the lack of training in Philosophy. Philosophy meant the discipline that inculcates in the students a penchant for asking analytical questions, the habits of evaluating claims, and the realization that the goods of the mind are as equally important as the goods of the body. (Marquez, 2017) The K-12 Basic Education Program, which is our country's major and only response to this indicates that the priority of our government is to train students to become laborers, not thinkers, visionaries, or reformers. (Reyes, 2015) And because there are not enough philosophy graduates to teach Philosophy, the subject is assigned to social science or social study majors who mangle the subject so badly that the young senior high school students develop a loathing for philosophy that makes them keep away from the subject all their lives. 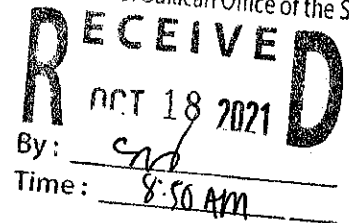
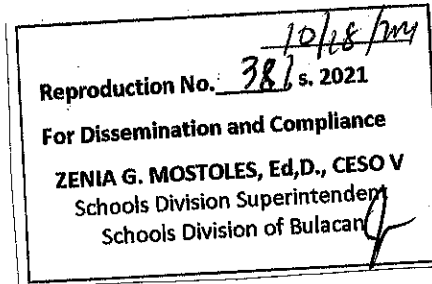
