Third National Summit on the Rights of the Child in Education and Pre-Summit Conference of Children

Concept Note

I. Background and Rationale

Children and their rights are at the center of basic education.

The Department of Education (DepEd), through the Office of the Undersecretary for Legal Affairs (OULA), launched the First National Summit on the Rights of the Child in Education in November 2019, on the milestone occasion of the 30th anniversary of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child and in celebration of the National Children's Month. The DepEd, fully committed to the rights of the child and undeterred by the COVID-19 pandemic, mounted the Second National Summit on the Rights of the Child in Education in November 2020, albeit held on a virtual platform. In both Summits, rights-based education (RBE) and strengthening the implementation of the rights of the child in education were central topics. As emphasized, RBE pertains to the range of rights of children in education, not only the right to education in terms of access and quality, but also the right to participation, right to protection, right to non-discrimination, right to health, and right to play, among others.

This November 2021, the DepEd, through OULA, will hold the Third National Summit on the Rights of the Child in Education on November 25-26, 2021. The Third National Summit is not only a continuation of the first two summits, but also a breakthrough occasion. Building on the gains of the first two summits, the DepEd, in recognition of its duty to uphold and continuously strengthen the rights of the child in basic education, issued DepEd Order (D.O.) No. 3, s, 2021, entitled "Creation of the Child Protection Unit and the Child Rights in Education Desk in the Department of Education" on January 15, 2021. The Third National Summit will provide a ground-breaking and seminal opportunity to introduce the rights-based education framework of DepEd, the Child Rights in Education Desk (CREDe, pronounced as "creed") and its work, initiatives and efforts of the DepEd on child rights, distance and limited face-to-face education during the COVID-19 pandemic, and opportunities and points for collaboration among stakeholders of child rights in education.

CREDe was created to uphold the holistic development of the child, in pursuit of the vision of the DepEd of "child-centered and child-caring basic education schools, learning centers, and offices, which respect, protect, promote, and fulfill the dignity and rights of the child in basic education so they may lead productive and happy lives as they participate in nation-building." The CREDe, using a legal and child rights lens, is mandated to act as the lead unit of DepEd to flesh out and articulate standards and meanings of child rights in basic education, as well as advocate, increase knowledge, and build capacity in relation to the rights of the child in basic education, with a view to anchoring and integrating child rights in the mandate and work of the DepEd.

As with the first two Summits in 2019 and 2020, the Third National Summit will reflect a whole-of-DepEd, whole-of-government and whole-of-society approach in upholding the rights of the child in education. Thus, participants in the Third National Summit will include officials and representatives from all governance levels of DepEd nationwide, public and private schools, the three branches of government, local government units, NGOs and international organizations, the academe, professional organizations, business, media, parents, and the children and learners themselves. However, as the rights-based
