

GUIDELINES OF THE DIFFERENT CONTESTS

SPOKEN POETRY IN FILIPINO

Guidelines:

- 1. Spoken poetry is a performance that is word-based. It is spoken or recited with emotion. It is an oral art that focuses on the art of word play, rhythm, improvisation, intonation, and voice inflection.
- 2. The contest is open to all Grade 12 students in all schools (private and public) in Region 3.
- 3. Entries must be in video form. The piece/composition must be related to the theme: "End Racism, Build Peace"
- 4. Entries must be submitted on or before September 16, 2022 through email to either Marielle Jessica Cayanan at mpcayanan@student.hau.edu.ph or to Khrestan Reign Silva at kgsilva@student.hau.edu.ph.
- 5. Name, Grade, Name of Adviser/Coach (if any), and Name of Institution must be included in the email.
- 6. The spoken poetry piece must be an original composition, in Filipino or English but not Taglish.
- 7. The spoken poetry must be delivered from memory or with a copy at hand.
- 8. Each entry must be submitted in PDF copy of the piece and a 3-5 minute recorded video of the delivery of the piece.
- 9. Appropriate sound/music must be used (may be original music). Videos may not use copyrighted music. No profanities or inappropriate language should be used.
- 10. Appropriate appearance/clothing or gestures should be used.
- 11. Videos must not infringe the privacy or personality rights of any living or deceased person.
- 12. Sounds, instruments, or musical background is allowed to complement the delivery. No deduction shall be made if the contestant opts not to have a musical background.
- 13. Announcement of results will be via email and awarding of winners is September 23, 2022.
- 14. Winners will receive a cash prize (GCash or Cellphone Load) and certificate of participation for the agency or institution.
- 15. The decision of the judges shall be final and irrevocable.

Rubric/Criteria:

- 1. Message/Content (40%) (must be relevant to the theme; has a powerful and meaningful message)
- 2. Delivery and Performance (30%) (delivered from the heart, facial expression, hand and body gestures emphasize the elements of the performance, enunciation is clear)
- 3. Originality (20%) (original composition by the contestant)
- 4. Overall Impact (10%) (total success of the performance)

1st Prize: P500 GCASH or Cellphone load 2nd Prize: P300 GCASH or Cellphone load 3rd Prize: P 200 GCASH or Cellphone loa

A. TED TALK

Guidelines:

A TED talk is a short presentation that focuses on technology, entertainment, and/or design (TED).

- 1. The contest is open to all Grade 12 students in all schools (private and public) in Region 3.
- 2. Entries should be original and may be in English or Tagalog. It should be a 5-7-minute recorded video. The TED Talk must be related to the theme: "End Racism, Build Peace."
- 3. Images or photographs may be utilized but must not infringe the privacy or personality rights of any living or deceased person. Real-life photographs may be used. If images/photographs are taken from the internet, mention the URL as a reference underneath the image.
- 4. All entry links must be emailed on or before September 16, 2022 to either Marielle Jessica Cayanan at mpcayanan@student.hau.edu.ph or to Khrestan Reign Silva at kgsilva@student.hau.edu.ph.
- 5. The Name, Year Level and School (department) must be included in the email.
- 6. All qualified entries shall be posted on the official Facebook account of the SED CSC.
- 7. Announcement of results will be via email and awarding of winners is September 23, 2022.
- 8. Winners will receive a cash prize (GCash or Cellphone Load) and certificate of participation for the school/department.
- 9. The decision of the judges shall be final and irrevocable.

Rubric/Criteria: The creativity and execution of the following will be considered:

- 1. Content (50%) (relevance to the theme, comprehensiveness, originality, insights)
- 2. Visual Appeal (40%)
- 3. Adherence to Guidelines(10%)

B. DIGITAL POSTER MAKING

Guidelines:

- 1. The contest is open to all Grade 12 students in all schools (private and public) in Region 3.
- 2. The poster must be done using digital tools. It must be an individual and original artwork.
- 3. The digital poster must depict or interpret the theme: "End Racism, Build Peace."
- 4. The digital poster must be size of an 8.5" x 11 inches bond paper (horizontally or vertically).
- 5. All entries must be submitted on or before September 16, 2022 through email to either Marielle Jessica Cayanan at mpcayanan@student.hau.edu.ph or to Khrestan Reign Silva at kgsilva@student.hau.edu.ph.
- 6. The Name, Grade, Name of Adviser/Coach (if any), and Name of Institution must be included in the email.
- 7. All qualified entries shall be posted on the official Facebook account of the SED CSC.
- 8. Announcement of results will be via email and awarding of winners is September 23, 2022.
- 9. Winners will receive a cash prize (GCash or Cellphone Load) and certificate of participation for the school/department.
- 10. The decision of the judges shall be final and irrevocable.

Rubric/Criteria:

- 1. Creativity (50%) (relevance to the theme/content, originality, insights)
- 2. Graphic Clarity (20 %)
- 3. Visual Appeal/Attractiveness (20%)
- 4. Mechanics (10%)
