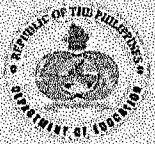

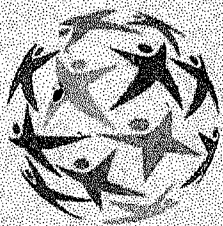
**Date :** November 14, 2022
