
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

ONE-DAY ONSITE TRAINING PROGRAM FOR PROFESSIONALLY INSPIRED PRIVATE SCHOOL TEACHERS

Schools Division Superintendents Heads, Principals and Administrators To: Of Private Pre-Elementary, Elementary, Junior and Senior High Schools

- The CENTRAL LUZON ASSOCIATION OF PRIVATE SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS, INC. (CLAPSA) collaborates with CONTINUING EDUCATION FOR THE LEARNING PROFESSIONALS, INC. (CELPI), PLDT TELESCOOP and the DepEd RO III in boosting the private school teachers' professional competency via its project dubbed as One-day Onsite Training Program for Professionally Inspired Private School Teachers in three separate divisions in Region III, namely: Bulacan – March 23, 2023; Pampanga – March 24, 2023; and Nueva Ecija – March 25, 2023.
- Participants will be clustered depending on the proximity of their schools to the identified DepEd divisions. The specific venues will be worked out by the Private School Associations in the aforementioned divisions and will be announced at least a week before the start of the training.

 - assessing and evaluating objectively student learning
 - preparing technology driven lesson presentation with pedagogical treatment
