Dear Regional Director Eclar:

The National Council for Children's Television (NCCT) is created pursuant to Republic Act No. 8370, otherwise known as the "Children's Television Act of 1997," to promote and encourage the production and broadcast of developmentally appropriate television programs for Filipino children. The NCCT is an attached agency to the Department of Education under Executive Order no. 203, s. 2003. Aligned with its objective, Section 7 of R.A. 8370 states that the NCCT must promote media education within the formal school system and other non-formal means through partnerships with government and non-government organizations.

Since its establishment, the National Council for Children's Television has been extending its media education services to Filipino children, parents/guardians, and educators all over the country with the support of private organizations, local government units, and various divisions of the Department of Education. With the help of its partners, NCCT works towards its strategic goal to institutionalize media education in the Philippines by 2030.

This June 30, the NCCT is holding a national webinar on **Understanding and Utilizing Media in Teaching (UUMT)** for basic education teachers interested in integrating media literacy into their lessons. The lectures in this program will be delivered via Zoom from 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., free and accessible to all attendees upon registration through this link: <https://bit.ly/2023UUMTNationalWebinar>.

Understanding and Utilizing Media in Teaching is a media literacy seminar workshop designed for basic education teachers. This program aims to equip K-12 teachers to deconstruct media messages for themselves and their students in a way that supports the learning of various subject areas.
