




General Guidelines

- 3. The Selection Committee has the right to disqualify or reject any entry that does not meet the set of criteria and mechanics of the competition.
- 4. The NextGenPH Project Team reserves the right to modify the competition mechanics and dates without prior notice in the event of unforeseen circumstances beyond the organizer's control. Participants will be promptly informed of any changes to the competition.
- 5. Interested participants agree that all submissions will be featured on the DAP website and social media accounts and may be published for promotional purposes related to the program. By submitting entry to this contest, participants grant the Development Academy of the Philippines (DAP) permission to publish their submission across its owned online platforms, including but not limited to its website, social media channels, and other digital outlets, to promote the initiative.

Submission Mechanics

- 1. The entry must be submitted by a group consisting of at least three (3) members and no more than five (5) members. Teams that do not adhere to this requirement shall be disqualified.
- 2. Each team member must be a bona fide Senior High School or College Student from any private or public educational institution nationwide. Participating groups are required to submit a signed endorsement form from their respective school, college, or university. 3. YOUth Taking Action. Participants may submit multiple ideas, with each entry answering the question: How do you envision Philippine public services in the next 10 years? Groups are encouraged to focus on a specific sector where they wish to propose solutions, such as but not limited to:

- 4. Interested group of students will need to submit the following documents:

Selection Criteria

The NextGenPH Selection Committee will review and evaluate all submissions to identify teams with the most promising ideas. Interested youth groups should keep the following criteria in mind, as these will serve as the basis for selecting the finalists.

Innovative (40%): The submitted entry introduces a unique idea that has the potential to improve processes and public service delivery, offering value to a wide range of users.

Feasibility (20%): The submitted entry demonstrates strong viability, with clear potential for adoption and scalability within the government.


Viability (20%): The submitted entry presents possible longterm success and sustainability when adopted.

Benefits and Potential Impact (20%): The submitted entry can drive meaningful change, improve efficiency, effectiveness, outcomes, and citizen satisfaction.

Once all scores have been submitted, entries will be ranked based on the ratings provided by the Selection Committee. The NextGenPH Project Team will then conduct a final review of the top entries to ensure the accuracy of the scores. Finalists will be selected to advance and present their ideas at the Pitching Event. Results will be communicated via email by October 2025.







Notification of Finalists

Finalists from both the Senior High School and College categories will be officially notified via email by the NextGenPH Project Team in October 2025. The email will include important details and step-by-step instructions regarding the next phase of the competition, including preparations for the pitching event, presentation guidelines, and key dates to remember. All selected teams are encouraged to check their inbox regularly and respond promptly to ensure smooth coordination


Awards and Prizes
