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CHANGE THE CURRENT 3.0

School-Led Climate Governance

Background

According to UNICEF, children and youth face significant climate change-related risks to their health and psychosocial development, particularly as the Philippines ranks 31st among countries where children are most vulnerable to the climate crisis. Hickman et al. in 2021 reported that 84% of young Filipinos are either extremely or very worried about climate change. These figures highlight the heavy burden borne by young Filipinos across the country and how the climate crisis directly hampers their physical, mental, and psychosocial growth.

This situation presents an opportunity to enhance young Filipinos' understanding of climate change. Providing them with access to quality climate change education is crucial in shaping their capacity to adapt to these impacts while empowering them to become catalysts of positive change in addressing the climate crisis.

About Change the Current

Change the Current (CTC) is the climate education and action program of the non-profit marine conservation organization Save Philippine Seas (SPS). It began in 2020 as a series of infographics on climate change and evolved into a capacity-building program for adolescents, youth, and educators from 2021 to present.

Change the Current 3.0

Change the Current 3.0 (CTC 3.0), through the support of UNICEF Philippines and the Department of Education's Youth Formation Division (DepEd-YFD), aims to build the capacity of the formal education system to lead climate change governance at the school level. CTC 3.0 Year 2 will be held in Bulacan, Camarines Sur, and Baguio City in partnership with the respective Schools Division Offices (SDOs).

The expected results of CTC 3.0 are (i) enhanced capacity of student governments and relevant school-based groups in contributing to school-level programs that promote climate-smart education and (ii) strengthened climate education and action community of practice in the SDOs.

CTC 3.0 Training Program

The program will have a Student Track and Teacher Track. The details are outlined below:
