**DISASTER AND CALAMITY PREPAREDNESS: PREVENTIVE MEASURES AND
SAFETY PROTOCOLS FOR LEARNERS AND PERSONNEL AMID TYPHOON**

1. In view of the latest weather advisories issued by the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical, and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) on Typhoon Uwan, this Office strongly reminds all concerned to prioritize safety and preparedness of all schools.
2. All schools are hereby directed to implement the following preventive measures and safety protocols:
 - 2.1. ensure the safety of all learners and personnel by securing classrooms, learning materials, and school facilities, particularly by placing those in low-lying and flood-prone areas in higher or elevated places,
 - 2.2. suspend or reschedule all outdoor and school-related activities that may pose risks during inclement weather conditions,
 - 2.3. monitor official announcements from the Department of Education, PAGASA, and local government units regarding class suspensions and safety advisories,
 - 2.4. coordinate with local disaster risk reduction and management offices (DRRMO) for updates and possible emergency responses,
 - 2.5. disseminate safety reminders to learners and parents regarding emergency preparedness, evacuation procedures, and post-typhoon safety,

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- 2.6. safekeep the records and learning resources on safe places that are unlikely to be flooded,
- 2.7. distribute the Self-Learning Modules (SLMs) today and allow learners to bring them home as a precautionary measure in case classes are disrupted due to the typhoon, and
- 2.8. prepare learning continuity modality in case classes will be suspended.
3. School heads are expected to ensure that these measures are strictly observed and that necessary reports on the school's condition are submitted after the typhoon.
4. Remain vigilant and uphold the safety and well-being of learners and personnel during this time in the spirit of unity and cooperation.
5. Widest dissemination of this Memorandum is hereby enjoined.
