## MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

### KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

This Memorandum of Agreement is entered into this \_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_ 2024 in the City of San Fernando, Pampanga, Philippines.

The **DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION REGIONAL OFFICE III**, an agency of the government with office address at Diosdado Macapagal Government Center, Barangay Maimpis, City of San Fernando, Pampanga, represented by Regional Director **MAY B. ECLAR, PhD, CESO III**, hereinafter referred to as **DEPED RO III**;

And

The **VALUES FORMATION AND SPIRITUAL TRANSFORMATION COUNCIL PHILIPPINES INTERNATIONAL INC.**, hereinafter referred to as **EDUCATION PARTNER** with official business address at Basement Multi-Purpose Building, Camp Crame, Quezon City, Philippines, represented by its Regional Director, *Daniel P. Osorio*

### WITNESSETH:

**WHEREAS**, the Preamble of the 1987 Philippine Constitution ordains and promulgates that "the sovereign Filipino people imploring the aid of Almighty God in order to build a just and humane society and establish a government that shall embody our ideals and aspirations, promote the common good, conserve and develop our patrimony and secure to ourselves and our posterity the blessings of independence and democracy under the rule of law and a regime of truth, justice, freedom, love, equality and peace";

**WHEREAS**, the 1987 Philippine Constitution calls on the government to support efforts to strengthen the ethical and spiritual values and to develop the moral character of the Filipino people;

**WHEREAS**, the Department of Education, hereinafter referred to as the "DepEd," is the primary government instrumentality mandated to formulate, implement, and coordinate policies, plans, programs, and projects in the areas of formal and non-formal basic education; supervise all elementary and secondary education institutions, including alternative learning systems, both public and private; and provide for the establishment and maintenance of a complete, adequate, and integrated system of basic education relevant to the goals of national development;

**WHEREAS**, there is a need to prepare the learners to respond to the challenges of modernization and the 21st century through the Moral Recovery Program;

**WHEREAS**, the DepEd believes that there are existing mechanisms which can serve to promote and ensure a sustained Moral Recovery Program for national development and solidarity;

**WHEREAS**, Proclamation No. 62 dated 30 September 1992 declared a Moral Recovery Program in response to the need to strengthen the moral resources of the Filipino people rooted in Filipino culture, values and ideals that are pro God, pro people, pro country and pro nature;

**WHEREAS**, the same proclamation has declared the Moral Recovery Program as official government policy and enjoined the active participation of all sectors in Filipino Society;

**WHEREAS**, the Moral Recovery Program's vision is a Filipino nation that is God-centered, people-empowered, prosperous national community living in Unity, Justice, Freedom, Love and Peace governed by a visionary government that is democratic, responsive and effective, graft-free, transparent and self-corrective with a community of civil and military servants who are professional, competent, disciplined and trustworthy;

**WHEREAS**, the Values Formation and Spiritual Transformation Council Philippines International Inc. (VFSTCPII), is registered with Security and Exchange Commission, in which the program is designed to conduct seminars and symposiums for every Filipino and to all public officials in our society as well as the Schools.

**WHEREAS**, the VFSTCPII aims to promote moral and spiritual values of the human person committed to the human building of just humane society and to arrest the moral decay of Philippine Society by covering positive Filipino Values as a source of moral consensus, national identity and pride;

**WHEREAS**, in order to exemplify and strengthen the Filipino core values among DepEd Region III learners, schools and its personnel, both Parties are committed to implement and integrate the Moral Recovery Program in the training/development activities especially for the learners;

**WHEREAS**, the DepEd RO III and the Values Formation and Spiritual Transformation Council Philippines International Inc. (VFSTCPII), hereinafter collectively referred to as **THE PARTIES**, undertake to collaborate for the successful implementation of the Moral Recovery Program to inculcate among DepEd Region III learners the patriotism and nationalism, foster love of humanity, respect for human rights, appreciation of the role of national heroes in the historical development of the country, teach the rights and duties of citizenship, strengthen ethical and spiritual values, develop moral character and personal discipline, encourage critical and creative thinking and become responsible and agents of change in nation building;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises, the PARTIES hereby agree as follows:

#### **DESCRIPTION OF THE MORAL RECOVERY PROGRAM**

The Moral Recovery Program primarily aims to inculcate the following virtues for national development: pride in being Filipino; caring and sharing; integrity and accountability; self-reliance; good manners and right conduct which shall also cover the value and habits of courtesy, discipline and respect for authority and institutions; people empowerment; and, self-reflection and analysis.

#### **Goal and Objective**

To provide and promote moral and spiritual values for the development of the human person committed to the building of a just and humane society and an independent and democratic nation.

To arrest the moral decay of Philippine society by recovering and promoting positive Filipino values as a source of moral consensus, national identity and pride.

Proper implementation of the program that shall develop Filipino learners to become Maka-Diyos, Maka-Tao, Maka-Bayan and Makakalikasan.

#### **Activity Description**

The activity covers 1.5 hours lecture, which shall focus on God-centered, love, unity, solidarity, national pride, patriotism, stewardship for the environment, natural resources and patrimony.

The conduct of the Moral Recovery Program in schools is absolutely FREE.

## **I. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PARTIES**

### **A. Joint Responsibilities**

Both the DepEd RO III and VFSTCPII shall:

1. Create a joint working group that will prepare the action plan to operationalize the partnership;
2. Form a joint steering committee to monitor the progress of the partnership and to make sure that the provisions of this Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) are met; and
3. Adhere to all laws, memoranda, and circulars pertaining to the implementation Moral Recovery Program.

### **B. Responsibilities of the DepEd RO III**

The DepEd RO III shall:

1. Provide guidelines, instructions and directions to ensure the successful implementation of the Program;
2. Issue a Regional Memorandum to all concerned Division Offices mandating support of this Agreement;
3. Designate a focal person who will regularly coordinate and work with VFSTCPII's focal person at various governance levels (e.g. Division Offices, District Offices and

- School level) to monitor the implementation of this agreement;
4. Assist in the evaluation of the implementation of the Program; and
  5. Perform other responsibilities necessary for the effective and efficient implementation of the Program.

**C. The VFSTCII shall:**

1. Assign a competent focal person from the VFSTPII to liaise with the DepEd RO III to monitor and supervise the implementation of the program;
2. The VFSTPII Moral Recovery Team shall implement the provisions of this agreement which focus in developing the spiritual and moral formation of the DepEd Region III stakeholders;
3. Provide comprehensive report after the implementation of the program;
4. Issue a Certificate of Completion to all learners, parents, teachers and non-teaching personnel upon satisfactory compliance with all the requirements of the program; and
5. Perform other responsibilities necessary for the effective and efficient implementation of the Program.

**II. EFFECTIVITY**

This agreement shall be in effect during 2023-2024, 2024-2025 and 2025-2026 Academic School Years. The DepEd RO III and the VFSTCPII shall submit their intention for renewal of this agreement through formal notice within thirty (30) days before the expiration of this Agreement.

The DepEd RO III and the VFSTCII reserve their respective rights to terminate their participation in the agreement through formal written notice within thirty (30) days before the effectivity of the termination. Both parties shall turnover all deliverables agreed thereto in the Moral Recovery Program. Termination shall be subject to mutual agreement between the parties.

**III. LIABILITY AND INDEMNITY**

The DepEd RO III and its field offices exercise authority and supervision over the learners undergoing the Moral Recovery Program.

The liability of the parties for any breach of this Agreement shall be determined in accordance with applicable laws.

**IV. CAPACITY AND AUTHORIZATION**

Each of the parties to this Agreement hereby represents and warrants to the other that it is duly authorized and empowered to execute, deliver and perform this Agreement and that such action does not conflict with or violate any provision of law, regulation, policy, contract, deed of trust or other instrument to which it is a party or by which it is bound and that this Agreement constitutes a valid and binding obligation of it enforceable in accordance with its terms.

**V. SEPARABILITY**

In the event that any of the provisions of this Agreement or any document that may be executed in connection therewith shall be declared invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect by competent authority, the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions of this Agreement or any document that may be executed in connection therewith shall not in any way be affected or impaired and shall remain in full force and effect.

**VI. BREACH OF CONTRACT**



Material violation or omission of any of the provisions of this Agreement shall be a ground for termination or rescission of the same without the need for legal or court action.

#### **VII. FORCE MAJEURE**

1. No Party shall be liable to the other Parties for any delay or failure to perform its obligations under this Agreement in case such delay or non-performance is due to any circumstance beyond the control of the affected Party, including, but not limited to, acts of God, fire, explosion, earthquake, lightning, storm, volcanic activity hurricane, typhoon, perils of the sea, landslide, flood, drought, war, invasion, act of foreign enemies, riots, plague, epidemic, pandemic, damage or destruction by lightning, drought, heavy rains, or other natural disasters, or compliance with a mandatory order or request of the government including quarantine (in this Agreement, singly or collectively a "Force Majeure Event"), without fault or negligence on the part of the affected Party. In such case, no Party shall have any claim against the other for any direct, indirect or consequential loss, injury or damage.
2. If any Party is unable to perform its respective obligations under this Agreement by reason of a Force Majeure Event, then the Parties, in utmost good faith, shall enter into discussions with a view to agreeing on such adjustments to continue the implementation of this agreement. In the event that the Parties fail to agree on the adjustments, any Party may terminate this Agreement by providing a thirty (30) days' written notice to the other Parties.

#### **VIII. AMENDMENTS**

This Agreement may be amended, modified or superseded only upon prior written consent of all the Parties or their duly authorized representatives.

#### **IX. SETTLEMENT OF DIFFERENCES**

The Parties shall exert their best efforts to properly resolve any differences or disagreements with respect to any issue that may arise in connection with this Agreement. It shall be settled through amicable means, such as but not limited to, mutual consultation and negotiation.

However, in the event that the Parties fail to settle the dispute amicably, and before any Party may proceed to litigate in court, the Parties shall first resort to Early Neutral Evaluation in accordance with the Rules on Alternative Dispute Resolution ("ADR") for Disputes between Government Agencies and with A.M. No. 07-11-08-SC or the Special Rules of Court on Alternative Dispute Resolution. Under Republic Act No. 9285 or the "Alternative Dispute Resolution Act of 2004," an Early Neutral Evaluation is defined as an ADR process wherein parties and their lawyers are brought together in a pre-trial phase to present summaries of their cases and receive a nonbinding assessment by an experienced and neutral person, with expertise on the subject of the dispute.

In case of failure to settle differences, the Parties shall not be precluded from submitting the dispute to the appropriate courts of the Philippines. Any cause of action for the enforcement of this MOA or any provision hereto shall be instituted only in the courts of competent jurisdiction, specifically in the appropriate courts of City of San Fernando, Pampanga, to the exclusion of all other venues.

#### **X. CONFIDENTIALITY**

Any personal information obtained by the Parties pursuant to this Agreement shall be treated with utmost confidentiality and privacy, during and even after the termination of this Agreement.

## XI. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

1. All Parties shall comply with Republic Act No. 8293, otherwise known as the "Intellectual Property Code of the Philippines" and other applicable laws and rules governing intellectual property in the Philippines.
2. The Parties shall retain all intellectual property rights owned by them which includes but is not limited to copyrights, trademarks, tradenames, trade secrets, industrial designs, patents, and any other intellectual property that may be contained in any the tools, materials or platforms (electronic or otherwise) that each Party may use to implement the Programs (the "Intellectual Property").
3. Each Party may use the logos and knowledge products of the other Party, in relation to this Agreement, provided that such use is limited to academic and promotional materials, which include, but not limited to, logos, brochures, press releases, websites and other social media tools, provided further that the use is necessary and directly related to the accomplishment of the objectives of this Agreement. The use of the service marks of DepEd, if any, shall be in accordance with its Service Marks and Visual Identity Manual under DepEd Order No. 031 series of 2019, as may be further revised by the DepEd from time to time.

## XII. MISCELLANEOUS

1. Except as otherwise provided herein, no Party shall have any right, power, or authority to create any obligation, express or implied, on behalf of any other Party. Nothing in this Agreement is intended to create or constitute a joint venture, partnership, agency, trust, or other association of any kind between the Parties of persons referred to herein. The employees of each Party shall remain its employees and the concerned employer shall be solely responsible for the wages, benefits, and emoluments of such employees.
2. In cases where the Programs will require government funds, such use of public funds shall be done in accordance with Republic Act No. 9184 otherwise known as the Government Procurement Reform Act and its Implementing Rules and Regulations, Presidential Decree No. 1445 otherwise known as the "Government Auditing Code of the Philippines" and other government accounting and auditing laws, rules, and regulations.
3. The Parties shall not assign or transfer this Agreement or any of the rights or obligations granted herein without the prior written consent of the other Party, and any purported assignment made without obtaining such written consent shall be null and void.
4. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Republic of the Philippines.
