**MEETING OF TESTING COORDINATORS FOR THE SPECIAL CURRICULAR PROGRAM IN SCIENCE TECHNOLOGY & ENGINEERING QUALIFYING EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SCHOOL YEAR 2026-2027**

1. The Schools Division of Bulacan announces the schedule of the admission tests of the Special Curricular Program in Science, Technology, and Engineering (SCP in STE) for the incoming School Year 2026-2027. *The qualifying test for the incoming Grade 7 applicants shall be administered in all implementing schools on **March 21, 2026, for EDDIS III, V, and VI, and on March 28, 2026, for EDDIS I, II, and IV.*** The coverage of the three-hour written test includes English, Science, and Mathematics.
2. In preparation for the Division-wide examinations, *the SCP-STE Testing Coordinators shall convene on **Wednesday, 9:00 A.M., 11 March 2026, at Bajet-Castillo High School*** to discuss the admission guidelines as per Regional Memorandum No. 034, s.2026 entitled Regional Admission Guidelines for the Special Curricular Program in Science, Technology, and Engineering (SCP in STE) Starting S.Y. 2026-2027.
3. This Division Memorandum serves as the travel authority of the attendees. Transportation and other incidental expenses to be incurred by the participants in attendance of this activity shall be charged against the school's Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses (MOOE), subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.



**REGIONAL ADMISSION GUIDELINES FOR THE SPECIAL CURRICULAR  
PROGRAM IN SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, AND ENGINEERING  
(SCP IN STE) STARTING S.Y. 2026-2027**

1. This Office announces the unified regional admission guidelines for learner-applicants to secondary schools offering the Special Curricular Program in Science, Technology, and Engineering (SCP in STE), including Regional Science High School III, Legislated Science High Schools, Provincial Science High Schools, and other recognized schools implementing the program, starting School Year 2026-2027.
2. The regional admission guidelines institutionalize a fair, transparent, and standardized admission process for SCP in STE implementing schools by ensuring consistency in eligibility screening, assessment, ranking, and selection, addressing variations in admission practices, and upholding merit-based standards. Through this unified regional system, admission results may be recognized across SCP in STE implementing schools, allowing qualified learner-applicants who are not accommodated in their initial school of choice due to slot limitations to be considered in other schools, subject to slot availability, compliance with prescribed procedures, and formal school-to-school endorsement, while maintaining inclusivity, program integrity, and alignment with SCP in STE objectives.
3. All Grade 6 candidates for graduation and Grade 6 graduates who have not previously enrolled in secondary school are eligible for consideration for admission to Regional Science High School III, Legislated Science High Schools, Provincial Science High School, and schools offering the SCP in STE. Eligibility shall be supported by the submission of required documentary evidence, including academic records and applicable health-related declarations, in accordance with the Admission Implementation Guidelines.
4. Schools offering the SCP in STE are encouraged to conduct information dissemination, advocacy, and learner engagement activities to promote understanding of the program, its objectives, benefits, and the unified regional admission system. Such activities may be undertaken prior to the official registration period; however, formal registration and school-initiated pre-screening shall



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commence only during the prescribed Early Registration period for each school year, using the available Grade 6 academic records in accordance with the official school calendar.

6. The documents below are enclosed for the information and guidance of all concerned:

- C. Enclosure No. 3: Basic Education Early Registration Form for DepEd Region III SCP in STE

7. Expenses incurred by the concerned personnel of the regional office, the schools division office, and the school for this activity will be charged to maintenance and other operating expenses or local funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

8. Teaching personnel will receive Service Credits, while non-teaching personnel will be granted Compensatory Time-Off (CTO) for working days that fall on holidays or weekends, as stipulated in DepEd Order No. 13, s. 2024, *Revised Guidelines on the Grant of Vacation Service Credits for Teachers*, and CSC-DBM Joint Circular No. 2, s. 2015, *Policy Guidelines on Overtime Services and Overtime Pay for Government Employees*.

**ADMISSION IMPLEMENTATION GUIDELINES FOR SPECIAL CURRICULAR PROGRAM IN SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING (SCP IN STE)**

**I. Purpose and Scope**

These Admission Implementation Guidelines provide a consolidated operational guide for SCP in STE for implementing schools and Schools Division Offices (SDOs) to support the unified SCP in STE admission and enrollment system. These guidelines ensure consistency, integrity, accountability, transparency, and proper governance across all phases of the admission and enrollment process.

**II. General Principle**

The SCP in STE admission process shall be implemented as a single and unified regional system. All admission actions shall strictly follow the approved phases, timelines, and procedures prescribed by the Regional Office. No school or division shall introduce or apply admission procedures that are inconsistent with these guidelines. Admission decisions shall be based primarily on the results of the Regional Admission Examination, subject to prescribed eligibility requirements, validation measures, and safeguards.

**III. Learner Eligibility and Qualifications**

Grade 6 candidates for graduation or Grade 6 graduates who have not previously enrolled in secondary school may apply for admission to the SCP in STE, provided that they obtain a quarterly grade of at least 85 in English, Science, and Mathematics, at least 83 in other learning areas, and no grade lower than 80 in any subject, based on the first to third grading periods of the current school year.

Learner-applicants who self-declare a health condition that may require support or accommodation shall submit appropriate health-related documents for information and accommodation purposes only, and such declaration shall not, by itself, constitute a ground for disqualification. Learner-applicants without any self-declared health condition may proceed without submission of health-related documents.

During application, learner-applicants, together with their parents or guardians, shall submit duly accomplished enrollment forms and a certified true copy of School Form 9 reflecting grades for the first to third grading periods, signed by the School Head.

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Starting **School Year 2027-2028**, learner-applicants applying to Regional Science High School III and Legislated Science High Schools shall meet higher academic standards, specifically a quarterly grade of at least 90 in English, Science, and Mathematics, at least 85 in other learning areas, and no grade lower than 80 in any subject. All other SCP in STE implementing schools shall continue to apply the standard eligibility requirements prescribed in these guidelines, while the adjusted standards shall apply only to Regional Science High School III and Legislated Science High Schools.

#### **IV. School Preference**

During the application, learner-applicants may indicate a first-choice SCP in STE implementing school and an optional second-choice school. The first-choice school shall serve as the basis for initial ranking, slot allocation, and waitlist placement. Indicating a second-choice school does not guarantee admission, shall not confer any preferential ranking or advantage, and may only be considered under strictly limited conditions prescribed in these guidelines, including the prior exhaustion of the receiving school's waitlist.

#### **V. Registration, Eligibility Verification, and Pre-screening**

SCP in STE implementing schools shall conduct Early Registration, either onsite or online, and receive documentary requirements from learner-applicants. Schools shall verify the completeness, authenticity, and consistency of submitted documents, particularly academic records and health-related declarations.

School-initiated pre-screening shall be conducted solely for eligibility verification and learner readiness assessment. Pre-screening results shall not be construed as admission and shall serve only as the basis for endorsement to take the Regional Admission Examination.

Only learner-applicants who have completed registration and school-initiated pre-screening shall be allowed to take the Regional Admission Examination.

#### **VI. Regional Admission Examination**

The Regional Admission Examination shall be implemented by the Regional Office and administered at the school level by designated School Testing Coordinators or SCP in STE Coordinators, under the direct supervision of the School Head and with oversight from the Schools Division Office.



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The examination may be conducted through paper-and-pencil testing or smart-device testing, depending on the capacity and readiness of the Schools Division Office and the implementing schools. The examination shall cover English, Mathematics, and Science, with fifty (50) items per subject and a time allotment of one (1) hour per subject. A twenty-minute health break shall be observed after the first and second subject examinations. Learner-applicants shall be advised to bring their own snacks and drinking water.

The specific examination schedule and testing time shall be officially communicated by the implementing school to the examinees in advance. Only learners who have taken the Regional Admission Examination shall be considered for admission, waitlisting, or second-choice school consideration.

Learner-applicants who fail to take the Regional Admission Examination on the scheduled date due to serious and valid reasons, such as documented medical conditions, may be considered for a make-up examination subject to the submission of supporting documents and the approval of the School Head, the Schools Division Office, and the Regional Office. Any approved make-up examination shall be conducted only within officially announced examination periods and shall follow the same standards, coverage, and security protocols as the regular examination. Absence without valid justification shall not be grounds for a make-up examination.

### **VII. Examination Materials Management and Test Security**

The Regional Office shall transmit official examination materials through authorized official email to the SCP in STE Division Focal Person. The SCP in STE Division Focal Person shall coordinate the secure reproduction, handling, and distribution of examination materials to implementing schools, strictly observing confidentiality and security protocols.

To ensure the integrity of the examination process, all offices involved shall observe due diligence and coordinated oversight in the handling, reproduction, storage, and administration of examination materials. In the event of any suspected or confirmed compromise of examination materials, the School Head shall immediately secure the affected materials, suspend their use if necessary, and report the incident to the SCP in STE Division Focal Person for coordination with the Regional Office. Appropriate measures, including the issuance of replacement materials or rescheduling of the examination, shall be determined in accordance with existing DepEd rules and regulations.



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### **VIII. Post-Examination Data Submission, Review, and Results Finalization**

After the conduct of the Regional Admission Examination, SCP in STE implementing schools shall accomplish and submit the required learner data through the official online data collection link prescribed by the Regional Office. Submissions through unofficial channels shall not be accepted. Submitted data shall include academic grades, examination results, confirmation status, and other required fields necessary for ranking and validation.

The Regional Office, with the support of Schools Division Offices, shall review and validate submitted data to ensure accuracy, completeness, and compliance with these guidelines. Learner-applicants shall be ranked based on their total score in the Regional Admission Examination. In cases of tied scores, the average grade in English, Mathematics, and Science across the first, second, and third grading periods shall serve as the official tiebreaker.

The Regional Office shall officially release the list of learner-applicants eligible for enrollment and the corresponding per-school waitlists. No school or Schools Division Office shall release or disseminate admission results other than those officially issued by the Regional Office.

### **IX. Determination of Authorized Enrollment**

The number of learners authorized to enroll in the SCP in STE shall be determined based on the number of qualified applicants or actual test takers, subject to regional validation. For guidance in determining the minimum number of test takers required per section, the following table shall be used:

### **X. Confirmation, Waitlist Movement, Second-Choice Processing, and Final Enrollment**

SCP in STE implementing schools shall facilitate the confirmation of acceptance of learner-applicants included in the official list of those who may enroll.



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The confirmation period shall be three (3) school days, excluding non-school days. Failure to confirm within this period shall result in forfeiture of the slot. Waitlist movement shall commence immediately after the confirmation period. Waitlisted learner-applicants shall be given two (2) school days to confirm acceptance of an available slot. After exhaustion of the school waitlist, second-choice school consideration may be processed, and learner-applicants offered a second-choice slot shall be given one (1) school day to confirm acceptance.

Second-choice school consideration shall be based strictly on the Regional Admission Examination ranking and shall not supersede, bypass, or reorder the receiving school's existing waitlist. Under no circumstances shall a learner-applicant be admitted ahead of learners already included in the receiving school's waitlist.

A learner-applicant shall be admitted to only one SCP in STE implementing school. Double-slot holding is not permitted at any point in the admission and enrollment process.

The final list of enrolled learners per school shall be determined only after confirmation, waitlist movement, and approved second-choice consideration. The finalized enrollment list shall be validated by the Schools Division Office and transmitted to the Regional Office for official documentation, monitoring, and reference.

Learner orientation and related school-based activities following admission and enrollment may be conducted by the SCP in STE implementing school in accordance with the approved school calendar of activities for the given school year.

## **XI. Duties, Roles, and Responsibilities**

### **A. Regional Office - through the Curriculum and Learning Management Division - SCP in STE Regional Focal Person or Education Program Supervisor in Science**

- i. Provide overall governance, policy direction, standardization, and quality assurance for the unified SCP in STE admission and enrollment system, and be accountable for its integrity, consistency, and credibility across the region.
- ii. Develop, standardize, and implement the Regional Admission Examination, including test design, structure, coverage, administration protocols, and scoring system, to ensure fairness, validity, and reliable results.



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- iii. Issue official regional guidelines, schedules, protocols, templates, and prescribed online data collection tools, and ensure uniform implementation of all admission processes.
- iv. Transmit official admission test materials through authorized official email to the SCP in STE Division Focal Persons and ensure confidentiality, security, and controlled access to all examination materials.
- v. Lead the review, validation, consolidation, and finalization of admission results based on submitted data and exclusively release the official list of learner applicants who may enroll, the per-school waitlist, and the final list of enrollees per school.
- vi. Maintain official regional admission and enrollment records for documentation, monitoring, audit, and policy review, and monitor compliance of Schools Division Offices and implementing schools, recommending appropriate actions for non-compliance.

**B. Schools Division Office - through the Curriculum Implementation Division - SCP in STE Division Focal Person or Education Program Supervisor in Science**

- i. Provide strategic supervision and monitoring of the implementation of the Regional Admission Examination within the division and ensure compliance with regional policies and protocols.
- ii. Coordinate with SCP in STE implementing schools on examination readiness, logistics, personnel designation, and adherence to prescribed procedures.
- iii. Facilitate the secure reproduction, handling, and distribution of examination materials in coordination with the Regional Office, and ensure compliance with test security and ethical standards.
- iv. Validate school-submitted admission data, confirmation results, waitlist movements, and second-choice processing, and be accountable for the accuracy and completeness of endorsed outputs.
- v. Consolidate and formally endorse the final list of enrolled learners per school to the Regional Office and serve as the official intermediary for all admission-related concerns.



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**C. School Level**

**School Head**

- i. Ensure the school's full compliance with all approved SCPs in STE admission and enrollment policies and procedures, and be accountable for the overall integrity of the school-level process.
- ii. Oversee pre-screening, examination administration, confirmation, waitlist processing, and enrollment, and certify the accuracy and authenticity of all school-submitted data.
- iii. Designate the SCP in STE Coordinator and the School Testing Coordinator and approve and sign endorsements related to waitlist movement, second choice consideration, and final enrollment.

**SCP in STE Coordinator or Department Head**

- i. Manage and coordinate the entire school-level SCP in STE admission process, from registration through enrollment, and be accountable for data integrity and compliance with prescribed timelines.
- ii. Assign, safeguard, and manage the Unique Applicant Number of each learner applicant and ensure consistency across all records and submissions.
- iii. Coordinate the secure printing, handling, and temporary storage of Regional Admission Examination materials in accordance with instructions from the Schools Division Office and the Regional Office, and be accountable for maintaining confidentiality and test security.
- iv. Facilitate pre-screening, acceptance confirmation, waitlist movement, and second-choice processing strictly in accordance with approved guidelines.
- v. Ensure the timely and accurate submission of required data through the official online data collection system, and serve as the primary liaison to the Schools Division Office.
- vi. Prepare the school's proposed final list of enrollees for validation and endorsement, based on confirmed slots, approved waitlist movement, and authorized second-choice consideration.



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**School Testing Coordinator**

- i. Administer the Regional Admission Examination at the school level and be accountable for the orderly, fair, and secure conduct of the examination.
- ii. Organize examination schedules, testing rooms, and personnel assignments, and orient all examination personnel on their duties and responsibilities.
- iii. Ensure proper handling, safekeeping, and accountability of examination materials and immediately report any irregularities to the proper authorities.

**Room Proctors, Checkers, and Encoders**

- i. Administer the examination strictly in accordance with prescribed procedures and be accountable for maintaining order, fairness, and test security.
- ii. Verify answer sheets using prescribed procedures and be accountable for the accuracy, consistency, and completeness of scores.
- iii. Encode learner information, academic grades, and examination results accurately and be accountable for the correctness and validation of submitted data.
