



DIVISION OFFICES**

In line with the successful launch of the National Vision Screening Program (NVSP) in partnership with PhilHealth's Yaman ng Kalusugan Program (YAKAP) last December 17, 2025, the Department of Education (DepEd) hereby formally endorses the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between DepEd and the Integrated Philippine Association of Optometrists (IPAO), Inc. to all Regional and Schools Division Offices. The MOU aims to ensure the provision of accessible, age-appropriate, and quality optometric services to learners through school-based interventions, pursuant to Republic Act No. 11358, otherwise known as the *National Vision Screening Act*.

Learners who fail the vision screening shall be referred by the DepEd Regional and Schools Division Offices to IPAO for comprehensive optometric services, including assessment and management of errors of refraction (EOR), binocular vision (BV) anomalies, and eye diseases. To avail of free prescription eyeglasses, referred learners are required to be registered members of PhilHealth.

In accordance with the MOU, IPAO may also provide assistance during school-based vision screening activities. Such participation shall not, in any way, hinder or affect the existing partnership between DepEd and the Philippine Eye Research Institute (PERI), which covers the training of Vision Screening Trainers and the recommendation of appropriate vision screening tools and materials.

The IPAO is communicating with the regional, provincial and city SDOs of DepEd to obtain the list of schools in their respective area of jurisdiction as well as coordinate the vision screening activities that we may be able to participate or assist pursuant to our Memorandum of Understanding (MOU).

We have established communication with the SDOs of the following regions: Regions I, CAR, II, III, National Capital Region, IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, VII, XIII, IX, X and XI and hope to commence activities in these areas within the month.


The learners who fail the vision screening shall be referred for full optometric services and will be required by Philhealth to register as a member in order to avail of the FREE prescription eyeglasses.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

This Memorandum of Understanding hereinafter referred to as the "Understanding" is entered into this 08 DEC 2025 day of ASIG CITY 2025 at PASIG CITY Philippines, by and between:

The DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, a government entity mandated by law to ensure the delivery of quality basic education, particularly Batas Pambansa Blg. 232, otherwise known as the "Education Act of 1982," as amended by Republic Act (RA) No. 9155, otherwise known as the "Governance of Basic Education Act of 2001," with principal address at DepEd Complex, Meralco Ave., Pasig City, Philippines represented by its Secretary, **JUAN EDGARDO M. ANGARA**; and hereinafter referred to as the "DepEd."

The INTEGRATED PHILIPPINE ASSOCIATION OF OPTOMETRISTS, INC., a non-stock non-profit corporation duly organized and existing under Philippine laws, with business office at Unit 102, G-F Hollywood Square Bldg., No. 33 West Avenue, Quezon City, represented herein by its National President, **CHARLIE L. HO**, duly authorized for this purpose, hereinafter referred to as the "IPAO."

Collectively being referred to as "Parties" and individually as "Party"

WITNESSETH THAT:

WHEREAS, Article XIV, Section 1 of the 1987 Constitution provides that "(t)he State shall protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality education at all levels, and shall take appropriate steps to make such education accessible to all";

WHEREAS, DepEd is a government agency mandated to:

- a. formulate, implement, and coordinate policies, plans, programs and projects in the areas of formal and non-formal basic education;
- b. supervise all elementary and secondary education institutions, including alternative learning systems, both public and private; and
- c. provide for the establishment and maintenance of a complete, adequate, and integrated system of basic education relevant to the goals of national development, while ensuring the well-being of its personnel and learners;

WHEREAS, DepEd believes that partnership is an important paradigm in delivering and achieving DepEd's education development goals and services, and to fulfill the mandate of the Constitution of making quality education accessible to all;

WHEREAS, the IPAO, as the Accredited Integrated Professional Organization (AIPO) of Optometrists, duly recognized by the Professional Regulation Commission (PRC), has around seventy (70) chapters nationwide;

WHEREAS, the Philippine National Survey of Blindness and Eye Disease Study of 2018 results show that 9% of kindergarten kids are affected with visual impairments, 16% of high school learners are found to have a visual impairment, and 90% of these are myopia;

WHEREAS, the Department of Health (DOH) - Philippine Eye Research Institute (PERI) Data in 2015 revealed that 10% of school-aged children have eye problems, 25% have amblyopia, and the rest have refractive errors;



WHEREAS, Republic Act (RA) No. 11358, otherwise known as the National Vision Screening Act of 2019, establishes the National Vision Screening Program (NVSP) under the Department of Education to screen the eyes and vision of kindergarten learners. This act aims to ensure that children have access to proper eye care, promoting their overall well-being and educational success;

WHEREAS, Section 6 of RA No. 11358 provides that the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) shall develop a benefit package for the consultation and treatment of eye diseases of children;

WHEREAS, the PhilHealth Optometric Benefit Package, covering vision assessment, prescription eyeglasses, and follow-up consultations for children aged 0-15, was implemented on January 18, 2025, as stated in PhilHealth Circular No. 2025-0002;

WHEREAS, the optometrists are the PhilHealth-designated service providers of the optometric benefit package for school children until fifteen (15) years old, covering optometric services and prescription eyeglasses, relieving the families of financial burden related to the cost of services and eyeglasses;

WHEREAS, RA No. 12028, otherwise known as the Academic Recovery and Accessible Learning (ARAL) Program, supports learners by establishing a free and effective national learning intervention program to ensure that all learners who are struggling in their lessons, especially in reading, mathematics, and science, will be able to attain the competencies set by the DepEd in their respective levels;

WHEREAS, learners with vision impairment or refractive errors need eye and vision examination and assessment, including management of refractive errors through prescription eyeglasses to see better, read, and perform better academically;

WHEREAS, both Parties acknowledge the importance of early detection, prevention, and treatment of vision problems, especially among school children, to support learning and overall development;

WHEREAS, DepEd acknowledges the need for licensed optometrists to deliver optometric services and be part of the referral pathway after conducting vision screening of learners at the school level to address the impact of vision problems on literacy and academic performance;

WHEREAS, the IPAO, as a national organization of optometrists with chapters nationwide, has members distributed in all the geographical regions of the Philippines who are willing to provide school-based optometric services to learners in public and private schools;

WHEREAS, the IPAO members in the various geographical regions of the Philippines shall participate by providing school-based optometric services to learners referred by DepEd for examination or assessment at the locations agreed to by the Parties;



WHEREAS, the IPAO shall assist in working out a scheme with its public and private partners, including PhilHealth, to cover the financing of prescription eyeglasses for school children.

WHEREAS, both Parties agree to enter a partnership to ensure the effective implementation of the National Vision Screening Program, the ARAL Program, and other eye and vision care programs for kindergarten, elementary, and high school learners aimed at addressing the reading comprehension, and learning and development issues of school children;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises and the terms and conditions herein set forth, the Parties agree as follows:

Article I. PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES

1. This Understanding formalizes the partnership between the DepEd and IPAO to ensure systematic referral of pre-screened learners from the school and its catchment areas to IPAO and its Regional Optometric Centers for optometric services.
2. The partnership aims:
 - a. to provide accessible, age-appropriate, and quality optometric services to school children through school-based interventions;
 - b. to establish a referral mechanism from the schools to the network of optometrists provided by the IPAO;



- c. to promote early detection of eye and vision problems, and timely provision of prescription eyeglasses for school children; and
- d. to facilitate data sharing and monitoring of vision outcomes among referred children, in alignment with DepEd health and wellness programs, to ensure optimum academic performance and overall child development.

Article II. ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Subject to a more definitive Memorandum of Agreement, which will clearly set forth the specific terms and conditions between the Parties:

1. **DepEd undertakes to:**
 - 1.1 Establish a national referral system with IPAO National and Regional Centers to ensure coordination, access, and delivery of comprehensive optometric services and intervention to school children with eye and vision problems;
 - 1.2 Include vision screening as part of the annual physical or medical examination through the Learner Health Assessment and Screening (LHAS) utilizing standardized screening protocols, ensuring proper documentation and parental consent;
 - 1.3 Identify and refer school children pre-screened by school health personnel or designated health workers with actual or potential vision problems to IPAO for comprehensive eye and vision assessment and intervention. The referral shall be properly documented using forms mutually agreed upon by the Parties;
 - 1.4 Provide education to parents on the importance of eye health and the optometric benefits and prescription eyeglasses covered under PhilHealth, with emphasis on the effect of vision on academic performance and overall child development;
 - 1.5 Monitor and record health outcomes and share non-identifiable data with IPAO for follow-up actions; and
 - 1.6 Perform other responsibilities necessary for the effective and efficient implementation of the Program.

2. **IPAO undertakes to:**
 - 2.1 Establish a national referral system with DepEd National, Regional, and Division offices to deploy optometrists to DepEd-identified schools to perform and deliver optometric services to pre-screened school children in line with the National Vision Screening Law, the ARAL Program, and other eye and vision health programs of DepEd;
 - 2.2 Accept and respond to referrals from the DepEd National, Regional, or Division offices and coordinate with authorized personnel in a timely manner, the delivery of optometric services to pre-screened school children with eye and vision problems;
 - 2.3 Mobilize PRC-licensed optometrists, preferably PhilHealth/IPAO-accredited members with training in pediatric vision care, in predetermined locations (such as DepEd offices, schools, or community centers) to ensure compliance with existing service and product standards;
 - 2.4 Conduct school-based or community-based optometric service provision for school children, with appropriate vision assessment, prescription, and provision of corrective lenses if needed;
 - 2.5 Conduct training of teachers or health workers in vision screening methods and protocol;
 - 2.6 Devise the process of PhilHealth Optometric Benefit Package availment to enable the learners to receive free prescription eyeglasses in accordance with PhilHealth regulations and guidelines;
 - 2.7 Promote DepEd's implementation of the National Vision Screening Program, the ARAL Program, and other eye health programs that will benefit learners and teachers; and
 - 2.8 Perform other responsibilities necessary for the effective and efficient implementation of the Program.

Article III. PROGRAM COST

DepEd shall not shoulder any costs or expenses in relation to this program.

Article IV. IMPLEMENTATION MECHANISMS

1. A Joint Referral Protocol shall be developed and adopted by both Parties within thirty (30) days from the signing of a Memorandum of Agreement, detailing specific procedures for patient referral, documentation requirements, and communication channels;

2. Both Parties shall collaborate in health promotion campaigns, school screenings, and parent-teacher orientation activities, with costs shared based on agreed terms, subject to the availability of funds and execution of a definitive Memorandum of Agreement. A Joint Monitoring Committee comprising equal representation from both Parties shall be established to oversee implementation, resolve operational issues, and ensure compliance with this Understanding, and
3. Periodic review meetings shall be conducted quarterly to evaluate effectiveness and update coordination strategies. Both Parties shall maintain comprehensive records of all transactions and activities under this Understanding for audit and monitoring purposes.

Article V. DATA PRIVACY AND CONFIDENTIALITY

Both Parties shall comply with the provisions of the Data Privacy Act of 2012 (RA 10173) in handling patient information and health records. Patient data shall be used solely for the purposes outlined in this Understanding and shall not be disclosed to third Parties without proper consent or legal basis.

Article VI. DURATION AND TERMINATION

This Understanding shall remain in effect for a period of two (2) years from the date of signing and may be renewed or revised upon mutual written consent of both Parties at least thirty (30) days before expiration.

Article VII. AMENDMENTS AND MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

1. Any amendments to this Understanding shall be made in writing and signed by duly authorized representatives of both Parties. This Understanding constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, or agreements relating to its subject matter.
2. If any provision of this Understanding is declared invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect. This Understanding shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Republic of the Philippines.
3. This Understanding shall take effect upon signing by both Parties and notarization in accordance with Philippine law.




