**SCHOOL-BASED FEEDING PROGRAM (SBFP) IMPLEMENTATION FOR
SECONDARY LEARNERS FOR SY 2026-2027**

To: SGOD Chief

All others Concerned

1. Pursuant to Republic Act No. 11037, otherwise known as the "*Masustansyang Pagkain Para sa Batang Pilipino Act*," and DepEd Order No. 13, s. 2026, or the *Institutional Guidelines for the School-Based Feeding Program (SBFP) Implementation*, this Schools Division shall implement the School-Based Feeding Program (SBFP) for Secondary learners for School Year 2026–2027. The program aims to address hunger, encourage school participation, improve the nutritional status of learners, support their growth and development, and strengthen their immune system.

2. Specifically, the program aims to:

- Provide daily freshly prepared hot meals for eligible priority learners;
- Reduce the prevalence of wasting and severe wasting among SBFP beneficiaries;
- Provide learners with healthy and nutritious meals to improve their nutritional status and overall well-being; and
- Enhance learners' capacity to learn and retain knowledge, thereby contributing to improved academic performance.

3. The program beneficiaries shall include adolescent pregnant learners, adolescent mothers with 0-1-year-old child/ren and undernourished learners belonging to vulnerable and marginalized groups beyond grade 6. Schools are directed to encode the feeding records and nutritional status of all beneficiaries in the LIS-SBFP Module accurately and within the prescribed timeline.

4. Beneficiaries shall be provided with freshly prepared, nutritionally balanced hot meals daily for eighty-one (81) feeding days and milk products for twenty-one (21) days. Provision of hot meals shall commence on August 10, 2026, while the delivery schedule for milk products shall be determined by the National Dairy Authority (NDA).



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5. Meals shall be prepared in kitchens managed by DepEd (separate from canteens), or provided through accredited catering services, strictly following approved cycle menus and established food safety and hygiene standards.

6. Each school shall organize its School Technical Working Group (TWG) to oversee the implementation of the SBFP, composed of the following:

Chairperson: School Head
Vice Chairperson: SBFP School Coordinator (Non-Teaching Personnel)
Members:

- Designated Health Personnel
- Gulayan sa Paaralan Coordinator
- Canteen Teacher
- School MAPEH or Science Teacher
- Class Advisers (particularly of identified beneficiaries)
- PTA President or Representative
- Barangay Nutrition Scholar/Barangay Health Worker
- Community Volunteers or Organized Feeding Teams

7. Schools shall accomplish and submit the following SBFP forms to the Division Office:

- Form 1 – Masterlist of Beneficiaries
- Form 2 – Summary of Beneficiaries
- Form 3 – Daily Feeding Attendance
- Form 5 – Milk Component (Milk Intolerance)
- Form 7 – Program Terminal Report (to be submitted within thirty [30] days after program completion)
- Form 8 – Milk Consent Form

8. Funds for the provision of hot meals and operational expenses of the SBFP shall be downloaded to schools based on the approved number of beneficiaries. The utilization of these funds shall strictly comply with DepEd Order No. 31, s. 2021, and DepEd Order No. 13, s. 2026.

9. The implementation of the SBFP shall be complemented by the Water, Sanitation and Hygiene in Schools (WinS) Program, Gulayan sa Paaralan Program (GPP), Healthy Food and Beverage Choices Initiative, and Nutrition Education Programs. These complementary interventions aim to promote better nutrition and improved learning outcomes through supportive policies, healthy school environments, and strengthened partnerships.

11. The School Heads and the personnel of the School Health and Nutrition Unit shall jointly monitor and evaluate the implementation of the School-Based Feeding Program.

**GUIDELINES FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF SCHOOL-BASED FEEDING
PROGRAM – ADOLESCENT SECONDARY LEARNERS**

I. INTERNAL PREPARATION

1. Schools shall conduct an orientation for teachers and parents about the implementation of School-Based Feeding Program (SBFP).
2. The schools shall create SBFP Core Group to facilitate the conduct of feeding. Schools shall only assign a Non-Teaching Personnel as the Focal Person.
3. Nutritional Assessment shall be conducted during the opening block of classes.
4. Beneficiaries shall be identified based on the criteria provided. (Adolescent pregnant, mothers of 0-1 yr old child/ren, and wasted and severely wasted learners).
5. Beneficiaries of SBFP shall be tagged in the LIS to determine completion rate
6. Schools shall ensure that all food handlers are oriented with Basic Food Safety.
7. The functionality of kitchens, feeding space, and handwashing facilities shall be ensured.
8. The school shall designate a storage area for food and non-food supplies. The storage area should be clean, sanitized, free from pests, and is well-maintained.
9. The school shall prepare the following:
 - Updated Sanitary Permit;
 - Updated Water Analysis (Coliform Test) for potability and safe water use; and
 - Updated health records and valid health certificates for food handlers

II. COORDINATION

1. The schools shall coordinate with the barangay/ LGU/ partners for the orderly distribution of food commodities and conduct of other activities related to SBFP.
2. The schools shall conduct advocacy and social/resource mobilization activities.
3. Schools shall encourage parents / volunteers to assist in the SBFP implementation.

III. UTILIZATION OF FUNDS



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1. The funds for the expenses of the hot meals will be downloaded to schools which will only be used for procurement of commodities for the hot meal preparation.
2. The operational allowance will be downloaded to schools and shall be utilized in accordance to DepEd Order No. 13, s. 2026:
Operational expenses downloaded to each school allowed under this program include:
 - *Essential kitchen equipment (e.g. rice cooker, gas stove, etc.)*
 - *purchase of basic eating/cooking utensils,*
 - *trays and crates,*
 - *packaging materials,*
 - *communication-related expenses,*
 - *reasonable transportation expenses from drop-off points to schools*
 - *common office supplies needed for the preparation of reports,*
 - *payment of labor and wages of kitchen assistants, and*
 - *other professional services to partners from barangay (i.e. nutrition scholars, health workers, among others),*
 - *payment for the health certificate of food handlers,*
 - *expenses related to the operation of central kitchen such as purchase of water, dishwashing soaps, LPG, charcoal, firewood, and kerosene.*
3. The schools are highly encouraged to hire a cook and kitchen aide to prepare and cook meals according to approved cycle menu, ensure the quality and safety of food commodities through rigorous inspection and proper storage, maintain cleanliness, and implement waste segregation and general sanitation.
4. In case of class suspensions or local holidays, the schools shall adjust feeding days accordingly.

IV. ACTUAL FEEDING

The school implementers shall:

1. manage day-to-day feeding, food preparation, and proper food handling and safety;
2. work with class advisers to provide meals to learners with habitual absences;
3. strictly follow the cycle menu provided by the division office;
4. strictly follow the Food Safety Standards; and
5. provide nutrition education prior to each feeding.



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6. Ensure that IFR or stabilized Brown Rice or Brown Rice shall be served with hot fortified meals.
7. Schools that opt to provide meals through catering services shall give priority to catering providers that are Hazard Analysis and Critical Control Points (HACCP)-certified to ensure compliance with food safety and quality standards.

V. PROGRAM COMPONENTS (EGPP, WINS)

1. The schools shall establish or assign a Cooking Area specifically for SBFP use for the preparation of Hot Meals. The assigned area shall be well-maintained and well-ventilated for proper air circulation.
2. The feeding area & cooking area must be equipped with hand washing facility and segregated trash bins for proper waste disposal.
3. Products / earnings from EGPP shall used to support the feeding program.
4. The beneficiaries shall be provided with free drinking water.
5. The beneficiaries shall practice handwashing before and after feeding.

VI. MONITORING AND EVALUATION

1. The schools must complete and present the following forms:
 - a. SBFP Form 1 (Masterlist of Beneficiaries)
 - b. SBFP Form 2 (Summary of Beneficiaries)
 - c. SBFP Form 3 (Record of Daily Feeding)
 - d. SBFP Form 5 (Milk Intolerance)
 - e. Nutritional Status Report
2. The school must submit monthly accomplishment report supported by MOVs.
3. The school head and SBFP Core Group shall monitor daily the SBFP implementation and gather feedback from parents/guardians particularly on the food distribution and food consumption of the beneficiaries.
4. Issues and concerns related to SBFP shall be included in the PTA / school meetings.
5. The school shall address operational and implementation concerns at the school level, including day-to-day program execution, school-specific incidents, and compliance with prescribed guidelines.
6. The school shall refer wasted and severely wasted learners to the SDO Medical Officer for further medical assessment and intervention
7. The school may develop innovations and best practices to improve the implementation of SBFP.
